Lori called for the Pledge of Allegiance At 6:05 pm, then called the meeting to order.

Unscheduled citizens: The selectmen signed an appointment for Jacqueline Frye to the postion of Animal Control Officer and she took the oath. Lori made a motion to accept the resignation of Warren Bailey as ACO. Kristin 2nd, voted and passed. Eric Gulbrandson brought in his CEO report. Richard Lyman request the town raise/appropriate \$750.00 for Sweden's bicentennial. There will be a pot luck supper February 23, 2013 for interested parties to help with the bicentennial.

Warren Noble inquired about the necessity of filing papers to run for an election. This is not necessary in the Town of Sweden. Nominations are made on the floor. He asked the selectmen to look into resurfacing the town hall floor. There is an article on the warrant for buildings and grounds maintenance. The selectmen will look into this and get estimates if needed. He informed us of the need of new flags for the town hall and town office and offered to put them up for us.. He asked about filling the holes and culverts on Hardscrabble road. This is scheduled to be done soon. Ron Keisman brought in the bill for the stone that was put on Louis Clark's property for \$495.00. The question was brought up of what was approved earlier. The minutes of September 25, 2012 show an estimate of \$400.00 . No set amount was approved. Ron will send a corrected bill, \$200.00 for the survey of the town hall land.

Finance – DJ: DJ passed our more budget material. Lori and Kristin voted on articles of the warrant for town meeting. Lori made a motion to have the town meeting on March 23, 2013. It was 2^{nd} by Kristin, voted and passed. DJ is to contact Ed Ryan about being the moderator. Lori made the motions and Kristin 2^{nd} the articles that were voted and passed today.

A total of \$600.00 in additional invoices has been paid since the last BOS meeting, but all are billed from SVFA accounts and were covered by association funds.

Annual Testing: Flow testing on the remaining SCBA units will be conducted this coming week.

Comments: Despite having to take care of several priority needs that were not previously expected, we were able to end the fiscal year under budget. As stated before, there is a strong need for every budget dollar but addressing most of the remaining needs earlier in the year would have run the risk of putting us over budget. With an operating budget so small, it is difficult to spend every dollar needed while balancing the need to have funds to cover unforeseen expenses. One major call can easily cost a department hundreds of dollars, if not more.

With the holidays, weather, work schedules, and various personal and family matters to take care of, most of our work on the station, training, and other areas has been on hold for the last month or so. Now that we are into the new year, we're be looking forward to continuing the forward progress. There are still many projects to complete and hurdles to overcome, and progress will be slow but hopefully steady. However, we have made many great strides this past year, and we are on a good path to bringing the department closer to an improved state of readiness and condition.

Thank You for the help and support since I've started, and I'm looking forward to continuing to work together in 2013!
