### 5. New Business

## - Outstanding Bills/Warrants

All three members of the BOS signed and authorized the outstanding bills/warrants to be paid. It was noted the only unique item in the warrants was authorization for the acquisition of a "new" fire truck as recommended at a previous meeting by Chief Cook..

## - Hiring Process Questions (Ms. Chadbourne)

Ms. Chadbourne asked the Selectmen several questions regarding the hiring process for their new (not yet hired) planning assistant to the Planning Board. Selectman Carty will follow up as to assuring our standard application form is also posted on the website. It was stated a drug test is not required for this position and a basic, free of charge background check would be completed online. References will be checked on all "final" candidates.

#### - Budget Committee Requests/Approvals:

Selectmen Frum, in collaboration with the Budget Committee presented the recommendations of the Budget Committee and sought approval from the BOS to authorize the amounts to be raised in each article as well as authorizing final distribution in preparation for the Annual Town Meeting. Each article was discussed and presented with the Budget Committee recommendations. Some articles were tabled pending

additional discussion and information, but many received the support of the BOS. A separate document presenting all decisions made will be attached to these minutes. All remaining articles will be brought to the January 26, 2021 BOS meeting for final review, approval, edit and submission forward into the Town warrant for the Annual Meeting.

Selectwoman Ridlon requested we post a separate meeting to include office staff to be held on January 18, 2021 at 5 PM. Selectman Carty will assure the meeting is posted on the website as well. It appears the BOS has authorized amounts to be raised in approximately 90% of the total articles which will be presented in the Annual Town Meeting. Selectman Frum thanked the Budget Committee for their steadfast work over the last several weekends and congratulated the Board for making substantial progress toward staying on our timeline. With completion of review expected on 1/26/2021, Selectman Frum indicated that will provide the Town with a bit less than a month to compile the articles, publish/post an annual letter to the Town which includes said articles and prepare for a March, 2021 Annual Meeting.

- Various Reports

Our Road Commissioner gave an update on assisting a resident to gain access to a road in which snow had made impassable. The Board provided thanks for the help and indicated we must identify if this resident is now a full time resident and as such, would be due regular road clearance for any NON-private road.
