

**WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING**

**To William Graham, Constable of the Town of Sweden, County of Oxford, State of Maine,**

**GREETINGS:** In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sweden in said county, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Town Meeting House, **on Saturday, the 30th day of March AD 2024, at ten o'clock in the morning,** then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

**Article 1.** To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

**Article 2.** To see if the Town will authorize the Select Board to borrow monies in anticipation of taxes as may be required to operate the services of the Town.

**Article 36.** To see if the Town will authorize the Select Board to **take such sums from overlay as may be necessary for the purpose of funding tax abatements.**

**Article 37.** To see if the Town will authorize the Select Board on behalf of the Town **to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for the non-payment of taxes thereon;** or by other judicial process; said real estate to be advertised in two separate issues of local paper within 30 days of sale. To be sold either at public auction or as the result of sealed bids called for and received by the Selectmen; provided, however, that the selectmen be authorized to sell at private sale property so acquired to the owner on record of any such property; all conveyances there-under to be by release deed. Except that the Municipal Officers shall use the special sale process required by 36 M.R.S. § 943-C for qualifying homestead property if they choose to sell it to anyone other than the former owner(s).

**Article 39.** To see if the Town will authorize the municipal officers to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12 of the budgeted amount in each budget category of the 2024 annual budget **during the period of January 1, 2025, to the March Annual Town Meeting in 2025.** The

exception is winter road maintenance. The municipal officers may spend more than 3/12ths of the 2024 annual budget amount for winter road maintenance to facilitate proper administration of the winter road maintenance contract. In no case shall the total expenditures for the year exceed the annual budget as approved by vote of the municipal legislative body (town meeting vote).
